



REGULAR MEETING

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of February 11, 2015 was called to order by Mayor Klein at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 6530 W. 79<sup>th</sup> street, Burbank, Il.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Foy to approve the minutes of January 28, 2015 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Szymczak, Looney, Pacella, Foy, Pyle, Grider and Piznarski.
- CITY CLERK** Clerk Roach reported that Burbank City Hall will be closed Monday, February 16, 2015 in commemoration of Presidents' day.
- FINANCE DEPT.** Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Looney to Approve Ordinance No. 1-2-15 reserving volume cap in connection with private activity bond issued by the City of Burbank. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Pacella, Grider, Piznarski, Looney, Pyle, Szymczak and Foy.,
- COMMITTEE REPORTS** Alderman Foy said he would like to thank the Police department for catching the guy who was dropping off tires behind business establishments. He said it was a job well done. Mayor Klein added that we used the plate reader as a tool for locating him so we do have some technology in this town. He then addressed the students in the audience telling him that we do have ways of catching bad people in this town and this was one of them.
- CITIZEN'S REPORT** The Chair recognized Jerry Synoga of 8109 S. Normandy who wanted to know how the gaming was doing and where the money was going. Mayor Klein told him the money was going into the general fund and he said he estimated that the City would get about \$150,000 a year and we are on target with that amount. He said there are about 56 machines in the City of Burbank at 14 different locations.
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Klein then invited the Reavis students in the audience to come up front after the Council meeting is adjourned to have their Government class papers signed either at the front table or at the Council table.
