



REGULAR MEETING

FEBRUARY 10, 2016

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of February 10, 2016 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79TH Street in Burbank, Illinois
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present, Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito Clerk Roach and Attorney Cainkar.
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of January 27, 2016 as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pyle, Pacella and Looney.
- CLERK'S REPORT** Clerk Roach reported that City Hall will be closed on Monday, February 15th in honor of President's day.
- NEW BUSINESS** Alderman Foy wanted to know if we have received any money from the State and Mayor Klein said we are starting to see a light at the end of the tunnel and the treasurer had told him they are sending some money which we can really use. He then said it is getting better here but he doesn't know if it is getting better in Springfield.
- CITIZEN'S REPORT** The Chair recognized Jerry Synoga of 8109 S. Normandy who asked who are the representatives serving Burbank. Mayor Klein said we have a few. Among them are Michael Madigan, Michael Zielinski, Steve Landek, Martin Sandoval, Dan Lipinski and Andre' Thapedi. He then wanted to know why we have so many for being a relatively small community. Mayor Klein told him when they drew up the map for the districts they had that many and then he asked if they represent Chicago too and was told some of them do and he wanted to know if that was an advantage or disadvantage to Burbank.. Mayor Klein told him since Michael Madigan is the speaker of the House it would be an advantage. Mr. Synoga said that is a matter of opinion.
- He then wanted to know what was the latest on the Melvina reservoir project and Mayor Klein told him that he just handed our engineer Tim Geary from Novotony 10 lbs. of paper that he can read thoroughly and if there is something there that we don't agree with he can bring it to the attention of our lawyers. He then asked what was the latest information on demolishing the houses. Attorney Vince Cainkar said that they have contacted all the property owners and they have scheduled appraisals on interior inspections except those who don't want interior inspections. They will start the project soon and will probably start making monetary offers in a couple of months.
