



REGULAR MEETING
OF THE
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL
JANUARY 27, 2016

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of January 27, 2016 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79TH Street in Burbank, Illinois
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Looney, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski and Pyle. Also present, Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito Clerk Roach and Attorney Vince Cainkar..
- The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
- JOURNAL** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Looney to approve the minutes of January 13th as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Motion made by Alderman Grider seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve the current list of bills. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. The Chair declared the motion carried. Voting Aye: Alderman Piznarski, Grider, Foy, Pacella, Pyle, Szymczak and Looney.
- CITIZENS REPORT** The Chair recognized Mary Ann McCullough of 7843 Linder who experienced two hit and run accidents to her house - the car coming from 78th and Lotus. She was asking for street bumps. Mayor Klein said there are advantages and disadvantages to street bumps. He said the advantage could be where they were in a school area to slow the traffic down. The disadvantage would be that they cause problems because when someone is going that fast and hits a skid bump they are more prone to lose control of their car and hit someone. He then said that he understands that we have put up a couple of barriers for you. She said she would be worried about the alleys in snow time. Mayor Klein told her we don't plow alleys except in a big snow storm where we help out. We simply don't have the manpower to do this.
- The Chair recognized Tom Jansen of 7838 Lotus who was interested in speed bumps also as the side of his garage has been hit and the Mayor told him that we will try the barriers with his property and hope it works because the guard rails are too expensive for 9200 homes.
- DEPT. OF ADMINISTRATION** Mayor Klein then invited the Reavis students in the audience to come up front after the meeting is adjourned and have their government class papers signed by anyone at the front table or the Council table.
- MOTION TO ADJOURN** There being no further business to be brought before the City Council, the Chair asked for a motion to adjourn. The motion was made by Alderman Szymczak seconded by Alderman Foy to adjourn was agreed upon by voice vote and so decided by the Chair.
