



REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE  
BURBANK CITY COUNCIL  
JUNE 14, 2017

- CALL TO ORDER** The meeting of June 14, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Dan M. Foy in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79<sup>th</sup> Street Burbank, Illinois.
- ROLL CALL** Roll call indicated the following members present: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski, Alderman Pyle, Mayor Foy, Clerk Szymczak, Treasurer Viverito and Attorney Vince Cainkar. Absent: Alderwoman Gustafson.
- JOURNAL** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderwoman Gagle to approve the minutes of May 24, 2017. The motion was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.
- CURRENT BILLS** Alderman Grider made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve the current list of bills. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- CLERK'S REPORT** Clerk Szymczak reported that a meeting was held on Monday June 12, 2017 with representatives from MB Financial Bank and Payroc and within the next 3 weeks the Clerk's Office will be implementing credit / debit card service to the public.
- DEPT. OF ZONING** Alderman Contreras made a motion seconded by Alderman Piznarski to approve Ordinance #9-6-17 allowing the rezoning and Little Oak Subdivision for the property located at 8521 South Nottingham Avenue, Burbank, Illinois. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.
- DEPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS** Alderman Mitchell Piznarski made a motion seconded by Alderman Contreras to approve an agreement between the City of Burbank and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees Council 31, AFL-CIO Local 1310, for the year beginning January 1, 2017 until December 31, 2019. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle

Mayor Foy asked for the cooperation of the City Council to approve Resolution # 6-1-17 appointing Barry J. Szymczak as the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund authorized agent. The motion was made by Alderman Grider and seconded by Alderman Pyle. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Mayor Foy then asked for the cooperation of the City Council to approve Resolution # 6-2-17 relating to participation by elected officials in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund for the City of Burbank. A motion was made by Alderman Contreras and seconded by Alderman Pacella. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye; Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

Mayor Foy then asked for the cooperation of the City Council to approve Resolution # 6-3-17 transferring and forgiving the Interfund Payables and abolishing certain funds. A motion was made by Alderman Pyle and seconded by Alderwoman Gagle. A roll call indicated 6 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderwoman Gagle, Alderman Contreras, Alderman Grider, Alderman Pacella, Alderman Piznarski and Alderman Pyle.

**CITIZEN'S  
REPORT**

The Chair recognized Charles Bandusky of 8548 South LaVergne inquired about the status of the Ceasar's Inn Property. Mayor Foy informed Mr. Bandusky that at the present time, 2 groups are showing strong interest, both of which would be beneficial to the City, but details are not yet available to the public. He then inquired about getting the carnival back at St. Albert's Parish. Mayor Foy stated that he and Clerk Szymczak attended a meeting that morning with Rev. Mariusz Nawalaniec and discussions are in the works. Finally, Mr. Bandusky inquired about the vacant 1<sup>st</sup> floor at Cole Taylor Bank. He was informed that possible remodeling and occupancy was supposed to take place months ago but no plans have been finalized with the City.

The Chair then recognized Randy Havel of the 8400 block of South Central Ave. He informed the Chair of a persistent rodent and refuse problem with a neighbor. Pictures were submitted and the Blight Officer was in attendance a told Mr. Havel that citations have been issued to that property a few times within the last 2 weeks. After reviewing the photos, Mayor Foy promised that this would be given the utmost attention. Mr. Havel, along with Mr. Paul Weisenbach also informed the Chair about excessive truck traffic on Central Ave. between 79<sup>th</sup> Street and 87<sup>th</sup> Street. They were informed that the stretch of road is under Cook County jurisdiction and that notifications would be made to the County for proper signage excluding truck traffic.

The Chair then recognized Mr. Alvarez of the 8400 block of South Central Ave. who reported a small sink hole on that block. He was also informed that, again, that stretch of road is Cook County but he would have Public Works investigate and hopefully do a temporary fix prior to County inspection.

The Chair then recognized Brandon Mann of 5551 West 84<sup>th</sup> Street would wanted to report a Pace bus stop pole which has been bent and without a sign for almost a year. Public Works will remove the pole a.s.a.p.
