**CALL TO
ORDER**

The meeting of March 22, 2017 was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Klein in the Council Chambers at 6530 W. 79th Street in Burbank, Illinois.

CALL**

Roll call indicated the following Council members present: Alderman Foy, Contreras, Szymczak, Grider, Pacella, Piznarski, and Pyle. Also present: Mayor Klein, Treasurer Viverito, Clerk Roach, and Attorney Vince Cainkar.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Pacella to approve the minutes of March 8, 2017, as presented was unanimously approved by voice vote and so declared by the Chair.

Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Szymczak to approve **Ordinance 8-3-17** providing for an appropriation for the General fund for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2017 and ending December 31, 2017 for the City of Burbank. Alderman Grider made the motion seconded by Alderman Contreras for the hiring of Police Officers Grant Bennett and Brian Staatz. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays, Voting Aye: Alderman Contreras, Pacella, Grider, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pyle and Foy. Mayor Klein asked the two police officers to step forward and they were both sworn in by Jay Bartusiak, Secretary of the Fire and Police Commission.

After everyone congratulated them Mayor Klein pinned their badges on them and then read biographies on them;

Grant Bennett is being appointed to the position of Police Officer with the Burbank Police Department. Grant is single and 25 years old. He previously worked for Loomis Armor Truck Company starting in October 2016, Prior to working with Loomis Armor Truck Company Grant attended Lincoln Way East High School in Frankfort and participated on the cross country team. He then attended Illinois State in Normal and graduated with a Criminal Justice degree in 2014. While attending Illinois State, Grant completed an internship with the Livingston County Sheriff's Department in April 2014. Grant will be attending the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy in Glenn Ellyn, Illinois on April 5, 2017.

Brian Staatz is being appointed to the position of Police Officer with The Burbank Police department. Brian is single, 28 years old and previously worked for the Illinois department of Corrections in Joliet, Illinois, since November 2016. He was a student at St. Laurence High School and graduated in 2007, after which he attended St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer Indiana and North Park University in Chicago where he graduated with a Criminal Justice degree in 2011. Brian's uncle is a police officer for the Chicago police department, Brian will be attending the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy in Glenn Ellyn, Illinois on April 3, 2017.

Mayor Klein then congratulated them and welcomed them to Burbank and everyone clapped.

Motion made by Alderman Foy and seconded by Alderman Piznarski to hire firemen Omar Sanchez and William Halpin to the rank of Firefighter/ paramedic. A roll call vote indicated 7 Ayes and 0 Nays. Voting Aye: Alderman Grider, Pacella, Foy, Szymczak, Piznarski, Pyle and Contreras. Claude Haeer of the Fire and Police Commission swore them both in. Mayor Klein pinned their badges on them. and read a biography on them.

William Halpin is being hired to the rank of Firefighter/Paramedic to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Firefighter/Paramedic Rich Adamo. He has been a firefighter with the Roberts Park Fire district for 15 years.

William is 36 years old, single and lives in Hickory Hills. He is a graduate of Stagg High School and holds the following certifications with the office of the State Fire Marshall.

Omar Sanchez is being hired to the rank of Firefighter/paramedic To fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Firefighter/paramedic Phil Russell. Omar is 27 years old. single and lives in Burbank. He is a graduate of Curie Metropolitan High School and received his Associates Degree in Fire Science from Moraine Valley Community College. Omar holds the following certifications with the Office of the State Fire Marshall:

Omar has been a paid –on call firefighter with the Burbank Fire dept. for five years.

Alderman Szymczak made the motion seconded by Alderman Foy to award lowest bidder the contract for 2017 LED Luminaire Installation – Phase 1 bid opening held March 17, 2017 which is Lyons Electric Company for \$121,998.00 He also told the audience that this is going to be a streetlight project for north of 79th street in the City.
