POLICE DEPT. REPORT	Chief Garcia reported the Burbank Police Department has over 700 arrests this year.
FIRE DEPT. REPORT	Chief Marty Kreil and 3 members of the fire department gave a demonstration to City Council and the audience with two new Stryker Power Stair Chairs. These chairs were obtained via a grant from Christ Hospital totaling \$32,000.00. The chairs can lift patients as heavy as 500 pounds up and down multiple flights of stairs. Mayor Foy added these chairs along with the fire department's power stretchers are reducing back injuries to the first responders.
BUILDING AND ZONING	Building Commissioner Joe Hession reported June 1 st to June 12 th , the Building Department has issued 36 contractor licenses and 72 building permits. Mayor Foy inquired about the status of the old Georgios restaurant and Cole Taylor Bank. Commissioner Hession states he is actively working with the owners and contractors to get the projects moving forward.
PUBLIC WORKS REPORT	Dir. Burris reported that he has located a hazardous waste hauling company out of South Holland that can pick up items the regular garbage company will not. An example is flat screen TV's and other electronics. Director Burris will get the specific information in the coming weeks on how people can get in touch and utilize this service.
