CALL TO ORDER	The meeting of June 12, 2024 was called to order by Mayor Dan M. Foy at 7:30 PM in the Council Chambers at 6530 West 79 th Street Burbank, Il.

FIRE DEPT.
REPORT

Chief Marty Kreil and 3 members of the fire department gave a demonstration to City Council and the audience with two new Stryker Power Stair Chairs. These chairs were obtained via a grant from Christ Hospital totaling \$32,000.00. The chairs can lift patients as heavy as 500 pounds up and down multiple flights of stairs. Mayor Foy added these chairs along with the fire department’s power stretchers are reducing back injuries to the first responders.

Mayor Foy inquired about the status of the old Georgios restaurant and Cole Taylor Bank. Commissioner Hession states he is actively working with the owners and contractors to get the projects moving forward.
